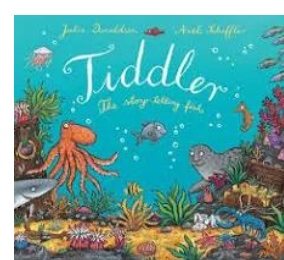
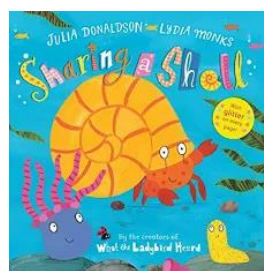
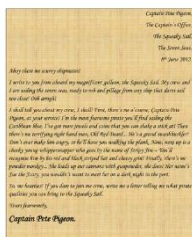

Top facts: What I should know...

An adjective is a describing word. A noun is the name of a person, place or thing. Grace Darling was a lighthouse keeper who helped save lots of men from a shipwreck. Summer is the warmest season in the UK. Fish are cold – blooded, live in water, have fins to move and have gills to breathe underwater. Victorians would go to the beach fully clothed, this was called sea-bathing.
